YMCA CAMP MANITOU-LIN CANDY SALE RULES

- All sellers will be required to leave either a \$25 deposit per case or Credit / Debit Card information – the card must be valid through the end of the sale. Your card will not be charged unless you fail to pay all funds due by May 22.
- Opened cases of candy CANNOT BE RETURNED. Candy **CANNOT BE RETURNED AFTER MAY 22.**
- You may check out two cases of candy per child – *up to a four case limit per family*. As those cases are sold and the money is returned to your local branch, additional cases may be checked out. *If you have returned more than one case during past sales, you will only be able to check out one case at a time- up to a two case limit per family.*
- There are 50 candy bars in each case. All candy bars sell for \$1 each. \$50 is due to the YMCA for each case of candy checked out. \$25 of the \$50 pays for the candy and \$25 will be credited to the camper's account.
- Parents **must** show a current Michigan driver's license or State ID and complete the candy sale contract, including signature, accepting responsibility for the child, candy, and money.
- All money and candy (unopened cases only) must be turned in by May 22, 2010.
- We cannot accept two-party checks or coins. Please pay what you owe in paper dollars or by your own personal check. **COINS CANNOT BE ACCEPTED.**
- Make sure you receive a receipt when you turn in your money. Do not turn in money without receiving a receipt. If any questions arise, you must present your receipts.
- A parent or legal guardian must accompany the camper/salesperson when the candy is checked out.
- You are responsible for the retail price of the candy (\$50 per case).
- **Candy credit will be applied to either Summer Day Camp or Summer Resident Camp only.** If the camper sells candy and then does not attend summer camp, the earnings go into the Financial Assistance Fund. Credits will be applied at the conclusion of the sale. Credits earned beyond the cost of camp can be transferred to another camper. No more than \$25 in credit can be applied to the camp store.
- Candy may be picked up and money turned in during regular YMCA hours. Check with your local branch to verify hours as they differ at each location. The money **must** be returned to the branch where the candy was taken out.

YMCA CAMP MANITOU-LIN CANDY SALE RULES

- You may check out two cases of candy per child – **up to a four case limit per family**. As those cases are sold and the money is returned to your local branch, additional cases may be checked out. *If you have returned more than one case during past sales, you will only be able to check out one case at a time- up to a two case limit per family.*
- All sellers will be required to leave either a \$25 deposit per case or Credit / Debit Card information. Your credit card will only be charged if you fail to turn in all funds due by May 22. Please make sure to give a credit card that will be valid after May 22, 2010..
- Opened cases of candy CANNOT BE RETURNED.
- There are 50 candy bars in each case. All candy bars sell for \$1 each. \$50 is due to the YMCA for each case of candy checked out. \$25 of the \$50 pays for the candy and \$25 will be credited to the camper's account.
- Parents must show a current Michigan driver's license or State ID and complete the candy sale contract, including signature, accepting responsibility for the child, candy, and money.
- All money and candy (unopened cases only) must be turned in by May 22, 2010. No candy will be accepted after that date..
- We cannot accept two-party checks or coins. Please pay what you owe in paper dollars or by your own personal check. **COINS CANNOT BE ACCEPTED.**
